6. Proof of age, parentage and **Photographs** are required on all Foals at the time of nomination.
7. Completion and payment of the Stallion portion of this form will make all foals conceived in the 2010 season eligible for nomination to the IHF.
8. Stallion nomination fees must equal the 2010 stud fee with a minimum of \$600.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

1. Eligibility for participation in any of the International Hunter Futurity (hereinafter IHF) programs is contingent upon full payment of the required nomination fees. Eligibility may be revoked if payments are not made by the required deadlines.

2. Foals will not be eligible for nomination unless the sire of the foal was nominated for the year the foal was conceived.

3. Stallions standing during the current season anywhere must be eligible and nominated for that season so that foals conceived during that season may be eligible for nomination to IHF programs.

4. Stallions nominated to the IHF include only those stallions for which the entire nomination fee shall have been paid. The IHF reserves the right to revoke the eligibility of any horse nominated in the event that the stallion siring such horse shall not have completed payment of such fees.

5. In the event the progeny of any nominated stallion are ineligible or unable to compete in any futurity events for any reason whatsoever, no refunds or foal nomination payments will be allowed.

6. Nomination fees received by the IHF will be allocated to Breeder's Awards and to the regional and international competitions.

7. In circumstances where unresolved double parentage exists, the last covering stallion determines eligibility for nomination.

8. In cases in which a stallion stands for under \$600.00, a minimum of \$600.00 must be paid.

9. A copy of the foal certificate, or notarized proof of parentage signed by the owner of the stallion and by the owner of the foal, must accompany the completed form and check made payable to the IHF.

10. Stallions who are bred only to mares owned by the stallion owner, and who are not available to outside mares, are ineligible for Charter Status.

11. Stallions bred only to mares owned by the stallion owner and not available to outside mares, are eligible for nomination to the IHF by a payment of \$600 annually.

12. Stallions who do not stand for an advertised stud fee shall be eligible for nomination to the IHF by the payment of an annual fee equal to the fair market value afforded to the general public. The burden of determining fair market value falls to the stallion owner who may be asked to furnish an affidavit signed and notarized upon request by the Board of Directors; if it is found that the fair market value was not established at the time of payment of nomination, the foals will be ineligible and the stallion owner will forfeit his nomination fees.

13. In cases in which a stallion stands for more than one advertised fee, this stallion may be nominated by payment of the highest established fee; the only exception would be in the case of a thoroughbred stallion which has a separate established fee for horses "not to be raced".

14. The IHF may desire to televise, broadcast, and/or record (on film or tape) the IHF and the activities incident to them, and to broadcast, exhibit and/or exploit same by any means now or hereafter known. All nominations are accepted only on the condition that the IHF reserves all rights to advertise the IHF in any manner it deems appropriate, including the use of names and likenesses of nominated stallions and their progeny. The nominator hereby expressly and irrevocably waives and releases any

rights he may have in connection with any matter referred to in this paragraph including, without limitation, any claim to the invasion of the right of privacy or to misappropriation. The nominator understands and agrees that any use by him of the name, logo, or material relating to IHF will be restricted by the corporation.

15. The IHF reserves the right to utilize the funds received from nominations in such manner as it deems appropriate, including, without limitations, the payment of administrative and promotional costs and expenses.

16. Of the horses which finish in the top ten in any regional or international competition of the IHF program, 5% of the monies earned in that competition will be awarded to the person nominating the horse as a foal; and 15% of the monies earned in that competition will be paid to the person nominating the sire of that horse.

17. Stallion/Foal nomination fees are not refundable after the nomination deadline. The nomination fee is payable and accepted with the understanding that should the event be cancelled, a pro-rata share of the original fee paid shall be refunded, less promotional and administrative expenses attributed to the nominator's share of the total fees paid.

18. Nominations and fees paid constitute an agreement between the nominator, the IHF and any other associated party, that, should any dispute arise, it shall be decided by the IHF and its committee, whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties.

19. The IHF reserves the right to cancel, postpone, or change the conditions of all or any part of the IHF, including limiting the number competing in the IHF, without liability.

20. Anyone who knowingly falsifies the nomination information will have their eligibility revoked and be barred from competing in any or all IHF competitions.

21. The IHF may charge starting fees for any or all IHF programs.

22. The nominations and entries are accepted upon the condition that every entry in the IHF shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that the person making it, along with the owner, trainer, manager, agent, and rider, shall: 1) Be subject to the rules and special conditions of the IHF and the local rules of the event; 2) That every horse or rider is eligible as entered; 3) that the owner and his representatives are bound by the constitution and rules of the IHF and the event, and will accept as final the decision of the executive committee on any question arising under said rules and agree to hold the show, the IHF, and its officials, directors, and employees harmless for any action taken; 4) That the owner, rider, and any of their representatives agree to hold the IHF, the show, officials, directors, employees and agents harmless for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the IHF, whether or not such injury or loss results, directly or indirectly, from negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees, or agents of the IHF or show. The construction or application of these rules are governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

23. There will be starting fees at all IHF competitions.
